Sgt. Stephen J. Ryan began his career in law enforcement in 2013 with the Delaware County (PA) Sheriff's Office. In 2014, after serving as a part-time police officer with the Upper Chichester Township Police Department, Ryan was hired as a full-time police officer with the Radnor Township Police Department. In 2017, Ryan was selected to join the Central Delaware County Tactical Response Team, where he currently serves as a team leader and sniper unit leader. Additionally, Ryan holds certifications as a firearms instructor, a less-lethal instructor and a field training officer. He was promoted to the rank of sergeant in 2023 and has a bachelor's degree from West Chester University.

#### **Q**: How do you envision the NTOA Command College benefiting you in your leadership role on your team?

A: After being promoted to team leader and assigned the responsibility of the sniper unit leader, I was looking to continue to expand my proficiency in leadership. After being offered the opportunity to attend the NTOA Command College, I eagerly accepted. The depth of knowledge that is accumulated throughout the three modules in the Command College is incredible. My understanding of the immense complexity of all aspects that make a SWAT team functional, as well as the importance of professionalism and leadership, has grown much more than anticipated when I signed up for the experience. Regardless of the factors that play into these challenges, I believe that departments and teams should be looking for candidates who possess three qualities identified by Patrick Lencioni in his book, "The Ideal Team Player." These qualities are humble, hungry and smart. If a candidate possesses all three of these attributes, it will positively impact the teamwork of whichever department or team is fortunate enough to select them. These men and women will become the future leaders of the agencies. In addition, I think it's important for today's officers to be students of the profession. It is not enough to merely show up. Each officer needs to seek to gain knowledge and further their abilities constantly. This applies not only to entry-level officers but all parts of the department. Learning should never stop.

### **Q**: How have the lessons in the Command College improved your interaction with other tactical teams and leaders in your area?

A: The lessons taught within the Command College and offered by the NTOA have provided tactical teams with best practices and a better understanding of the standards. With many regional tactical teams in my area embracing the NTOA and the courses offered, the consistency of operations and procedures when assisting one another has greatly improved.
